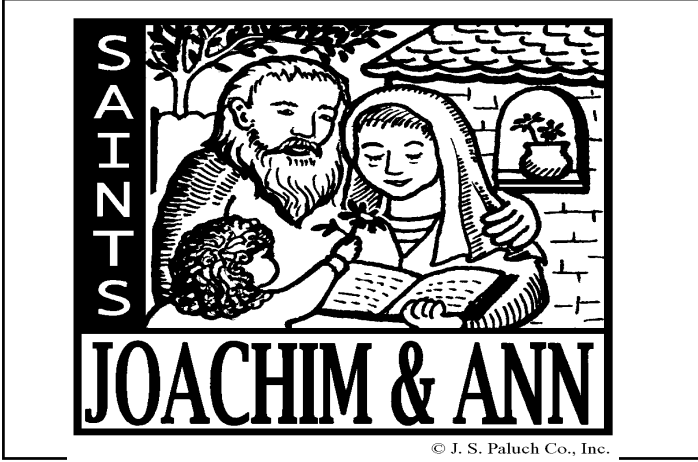

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

“Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her.”

For several weeks we have been listening to Gospel stories that focus on Christian behavior and relationships. This week, the first reading and Gospel remind us that **hospitality is a hallmark of Christian behavior. Christian hospitality is, at its heart, a work of justice. We are called to extend a welcome to anyone who comes into our midst.** Like the message from last week’s parable of the Good Samaritan, **this call to hospitality has challenging implications.
