



Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, Tuesday, June 29th

The Church places before us saints of all types: apostles and prophets, rich and poor, women and men, married and unmarried. On Thursday we focus on Saints Peter and Paul. These were men whose lives were marked by failure and disappointment. Remember that Paul began his career persecuting Christians and Peter denied three times that he even knew the Lord Jesus. Yet these men are real pillars upon which the Church is built. Just as they were called to holiness of life in spite of their failings, so too, are we called to that same holiness. This day is a celebration of two human beings who struggled throughout their lives. Let us open our hearts to listen to God's voice, even in the midst of our own struggles and failings. Let us pray that Saints Peter and Paul will intercede on our behalf.

POPE ASKS PARENTS TO HELP THEIR CHILDREN DISCOVER IMPORTANCE OF SUNDAY MASS

During the recitation of the Angelus in St. Peter's Square, **Pope Benedict XVI** underscored the **importance of Sunday as the *Day of the Lord*** and asked every Catholic family to accept the invitation of Christ to **attend Sunday Mass with their children**, thus helping them to **discover the value and importance of the Eucharist for their lives**. The Pope also reminded the faithful present that **“Sunday Mass must never be felt as an imposition or weight, but rather as a need and a joy,”** for **“gathering together with our brothers and sisters, listening to the Word of God, and being nourished by Christ sacrificed for us is an experience that gives meaning to life and brings peace to the heart. *We Christians cannot live without Sundays*”**. Our Catholic identity is marked by our presence at the weekend Eucharistic Celebrations.

Our Annual Summer Festival in 4 Weeks

This is our ***one big annual parish fundraiser***. Over the past several years we have realized a profit of about \$30,000 each year from this parish effort. We certainly need patrons who spend, but they cannot spend unless there are ***workers*** in the various booths. Without workers, the booths are closed, and patrons cannot spend! So, it is obvious that we need the cooperation of ***all*** parishioners, not just as patrons, but ***workers as well***.

If you are a long-time parishioner, we really appreciate what you did in the past—**but we still need your help now!** If you are school parents, **we need your help, because this profit keeps your tuition down!** And if you are a parishioner who has not yet helped, **we need you to give some time!** So beginning today, and for the next four Sundays, see ***Jason Bevan or Bev. Stavor*** after Mass and make a **commitment to help!**

Not only is help needed on the 2 days of the *Festival*, but also on the few days leading up to it — ***for example:***

KITCHEN HELP — on Thursday and Friday mornings, to bread fish, cut buns, and make general preparations.

GROUNDS SET-UP HELP — on Wednesday/Thursday nights, to prepare booths, set up tables, wire lights, etc.
(*Help is also needed after the Festival on Saturday night to tear down and clean up.*)

WHITE ELEPHANT HELP — on Tuesday and Wednesday and Thursday, to display donations and set prices.
