

TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

As stated at the outset, this parable has a double thrust. **Pray always:** if even an unjust judge pays attention to repeated requests, God certainly will. **Do not lose heart** or turn away from wearing down injustice. Two distinct points intimately connected. Not to separate recipes, one for producing results with God, by persistent prayer, one for dealing with scoundrels, by persistent nagging. If taken separately, bizarre scenarios might follow. Taking the religious point in isolation, were our unjust judge to pray hard, would God grant him an unending supply of widows to exploit? Alternatively, taking the social point alone, could our widow seeking justice turn up the pressure by kidnapping the crooked judge's favorite camel? No, **Jesus is telling us that successful prayer and a thirst for justice are linked.** He tells us that God hears those who have made their own desire God's desire for justice, "on earth as it is in heaven," but who know



that the way to justice is not through injustice but through persistent and untiring fidelity to God's will.
