

#### FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Have you ever been so confused that you wished God would give you a sign to show you the way? In our first reading, God invites Ahaz to "ask for a sign from the Lord" and reveals that the sign will be Mary, a virgin, pregnant with Jesus, Emmanuel. Similarly, in the Gospel when Joseph is shocked to find that his fiancée is pregnant, he receives a sign from an angel telling him not to be afraid to marry Mary. The Lord has a good sign waiting for you too, if you ask for it. It may not come today or tomorrow, but it will come. Do not expect to find your sign in superstitions, horoscopes, or ouija boards. Expect your sign from Jesus, as He reveals Himself in

prayer, the sacraments, and the counsel of faithful friends. Of course we discover Jesus most intimately at Mass, when He becomes miraculously present in the Eucharist. Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us." —So ask for your sign, expect your sign, and follow it like Joseph with confidence and joy.
