

THE TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

It's easy to become frustrated by life and question why God allows bad things to happen. Sometimes we think we could do a better job than God! But our compassionate Lord reminds us that a greater good will be brought out of every difficulty: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above **your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts."** These marvelous words put our minds at rest, freeing us to sing joyful songs of praise in today's responsorial psalm. Our praise is echoed in the second reading.



Paul rejoices that because Christ lives in him, he is equally joyful whether he lives or dies because "Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death." We can experience this same sentiment in our daily lives. Then we understand the parable of the workers in the field in today's Gospel, in which Jesus assures us that we will share equally in the reward of eternal life. How does it comfort you to know that God's ways are high above yours?

The Mass

"By the Eucharistic celebration, we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all."

"For Catholics, Mass attendance is a vital part of weekly, if not daily, life. It is the time to gather together in God's presence, to be nourished in a special way by God and by one another. We listen to the words of Scripture, we pray together, and we share the ultimate food for the soul—the Body and Blood of Christ. Furthermore, we do all these things in a prescribed order, using many of the same words and rituals that have been used for nearly two thousand years.

Mass etiquette begins with a fundamental respect for the importance and sanctity of the Mass. An attitude of reverence should guide behavior at any religious service, but for Catholics it is especially true. From earliest childhood, Catholics are taught to show the utmost respect and reverence for this sacred and mysterious gift of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. The bread and wine do not merely symbolize Christ; they are changed into the Body and Blood of Christ (CCC, 1413).

This central belief sets Catholics apart from most other Christian denominations. What does this mean for Catholics and guests at Mass? At a minimum, it asks the presence and behavior of those present throughout the service not detract in any way from the reverence accorded to the Mass. Our choice of clothing, posture, and participation should all reflect an attitude of dignity and attentiveness.
