



## SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

**First Reading:** *Isaiah 11:1-10.* A descendent of Jesse will usher in a time of peace.

**Responsorial Psalm:** *Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 12-13, 17.* The Messiah will bring justice and peace to the nations.

**Second Reading:** *Romans 15:4-9.* Both Jews and Gentiles glorify God for the salvation found in Christ Jesus.

**Gospel Reading:** *Matthew 3:1-12.* John the Baptist appears in Judea preaching a message of repentance.

### **Reflecting on God's Word**

As she was stringing her Christmas lights Paula pondered the unsightly stump in her yard. Last spring she had noticed that her pretty red bush that was usually covered with tiny white flowers—wasn't! Then the leaves had come slowly and never reached their normal size. Within a few weeks they were turning brown and falling off the bush. It must be dead, she had thought. Perhaps the winter had been too hard on it. She hated to see it go, but late in September Paula found her ax and her courage, and chopped the bush down to a stump. She was about to lay the ax to the root when her neighbor stopped her. "Leave the stump through next summer. You never know. New healthy shoots can sprout from stumps that appear to be dead. As long as the roots are alive, there's hope." If there was hope for that stump, Paula thought, maybe there was hope for her seemingly fruitless life as well. Again this week one of the O Antiphons expresses the spirit of the Advent scriptures. We pray, "Come, Flower of Jesse's stem," echoing Isaiah's spirit of hopeful expectation that a Messiah would sprout forth and flower from the seemingly dead stump of Jesse's family tree, inaugurating God's kingdom of justice and peace. We pray, "Sign for all peoples," conveying Paul's message that Jesus Christ showed God's faithfulness to the hopes of the patriarchs as well as mercy to the Gentiles. We pray, "Let nothing keep you from coming to our aid," reflecting John the Baptist's confidence that the Messiah and his kingdom are indeed "at hand."

This year the feast is celebrated on Monday and therefore is not a Holy Day of Obligation. Holy Trinity scheduled Mass 8am. St. Agnes Mass at 8:15am.

Any Catholic individual searching for a way to better **prepare for Christmas** doesn't need to look any further than the parish confessional room. **Do you want to find peace? Do you want to grow spiritually?** You are nervous because it has been a long time since you have been to confession. **Respond to the movement of the spirit within yourself and take the plunge.** Don't worry about what to say or how to say it. Mention those sins and request forgiveness. **Trust in God's mercy** even if you haven't been to confession in 4, 7, 10 or 15 years. **Come home to a loving Father waiting to forgive you.** *A number of priests will be available.* The Penance Service will begin with prayer and reflection, with personal confession to follow, individually! The Holy Trinity Penance Service will be on Tuesday, December 17th, at 7pm, and the St. Agnes Penance Service will be on Wednesday, December 18th, at 7pm.



**The Light is Still On for You!** "The Light is Still On for You!" is an initiative of the Diocese to encourage Catholics to avail themselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confession is a wonderful opportunity to set aside our sinful ways and draw closer to our Lord. Confession will be available on **Wednesday, December 11**, from 6pm to 9pm in every Catholic parish in the Diocese.
