TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



First Reading: Proverbs 9:1-6. Wisdom has set a feast before us.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7. A prayer of praise to God for his goodness.

Second Reading: Ephesians 5:15-20. Filled with the Spirit, Christians strive to follow the will of the Lord.

Gospel Reading: John 6:51-58. Jesus teaches that whoever eats his flesh and drinks his blood will live forever.

Reflecting on God's Word

As a boy, I was often sent to Kauder's Bakery on the corner of Preston and Ensor Streets in Baltimore. There was nothing like the variety of breads today, but whether it was white, rye, or Vienna, the smell of fresh-baked bread and especially the crunch of the crust stays with me more than sixty years later.

Kauder's came to mind after reading today's Gospel. Biblical scholars point out that the crowds would have been appalled at Jesus' words: "Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:53). The word used for "eat" is a very physical word, the equivalent of munching or chewing. To hear "eat my flesh" would have been repulsive. An invitation to cannibalism! The same with "drink my blood." Jewish law was very clear that no blood should remain in any animal slaughtered for eating. Blood was the "seat of life" and life belonged only to God.

But this is precisely the point. Behind this "sign" is God's wondrous life-giving plan: to bring us into intimate communion when we partake of the very life of the Word made flesh, Jesus Christ. We are not to get drunk on the wine of this world but on the divinized drink of everlasting life. Not mundane manna but the bread that mediates an encounter with the Lord of our salvation. This is truly Wisdom's house, where we eat both the bread of God's word and the bread that is the Lamb of God.



Why We Need to Go to Mass?

Normal complaints of children, “*Why do we have to go to Mass?*” The **Catechism of the Catholic Church** states: “*The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Catholic practice.* For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on the days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason or dispensed by their own pastor. *Those who deliberately fail this obligation commit a grave sin.*” This attendance is a need as common to a Catholic as the need to eat and breathe. ***One's participation in this communal celebration is a testimony of belonging and of being faithful to Christ and His Church.*** There is never a vacation from God. There is never a vacation from church.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR MASS ATTENDANCE

1. Get there on time. Would you come late to a dinner party?
2. Forgotten what to do at Mass? It’s like riding a bike. Plus, every parish has a “how to” handbook.
3. It’s called the missalette or order of worship. Just read along.
4. Dress appropriately. Would you wear athletic clothes to a wedding?
5. The reception of Communion is open to all Catholics who are not conscious of serious sin.
6. Remember to fast for one hour prior to Communion.
7. Sing. Active participation will make the experience more meaningful to you.
