

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: *Wisdom 7:7-11.* Wisdom is preferred above gold and silver.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 90:12-13, 14-15, 16-17.* The Lord fills us with love and joy.

Second Reading: *Hebrews 4:12-13.* The Word of God exposes the heart.

Gospel Reading: *Mark 10:17-30 (shorter form Mark 10:17-27).* A man with many possessions asks Jesus what he must do to gain eternal life.

Reflecting on God's Word

When the rich young man in this week's Gospel asks Jesus what he must *do* to inherit eternal life, the answer is simply "nothing." Or to put it another way, "You don't have to *do* anything to earn it. Simply *do not* let anything get in the way. Don't kill, or commit adultery, or steal, or lie, or defraud, or any such things that tend to muddy the focus of our lives." Beyond that it seems we don't have to *do* anything. But, the young man protests, he has avoided all these things. And so the reply Jesus then offers is, in effect, don't let your riches get in the way either.

Easier said than done, and more difficult than imagined. More difficult than threading a needle with camel hair when the hair is still on the camel; more difficult than getting a camel inside your house, whether through your pet door or your back door or maybe even your garage door. Camels don't shrink. Neither does our hold on riches. Both tend to get in the way.

So what does one then do, we ask. Curious—that was the same response in Jesus' day as well. And over the centuries believers have sought ways to keep wealth in perspective, or at least some things that might help do so. Yet it's all about trying to make sure that as little as possible gets in the way of finding God among the mishmash of life.

POPE FRANCIS TOP 10 TIPS FOR BRINGING GRATER JOY TO ONE'S LIFE:

1. ***“Live and let live.”*** Everyone should be guided by this principle.
2. ***“Be giving of yourself to others.”*** People need to be generous toward others, because if you withdraw into yourself, you run the risk of becoming egocentric. And stagnant water becomes putrid.
3. ***“Proceed calmly”*** in life. The pope, who used to teach high school literature, used an image from an Argentine novel, in which the protagonist looks back on how he lived his life. “He says that in his youth he was a stream full of rocks that he carried with him; as an adult, a rushing river; and in old age, he was still moving, but slowly, like a pool of water.” He likes this latter image of a pool of water -- to have the ability to move with kindness and humility, calmness in life.
4. ***“A healthy sense of leisure.”*** The pleasures of art, literature and playing together with children has been lost. Consumerism has brought us anxiety and stress, causing people to lose a healthy culture of leisure. Even though many parents work long hours, they must set aside time to play with their children. Work schedules make it complicated, but you must do it. Turn off the TV when sitting down to eat.
5. ***“Sundays should be holidays.”*** Workers should have Sundays off because “Sunday is for family.”
6. ***Find innovative ways to create dignified jobs for young people.*** We need to be creative with young people. If they have no opportunities they will get into drugs and be more vulnerable to suicide. Dignity is given to you when you can bring food home from one's own labor.
7. ***“Respect and take care of nature.”*** Environmental degradation is one of the biggest challenges we have. I think a question that we're not asking ourselves is: Isn't humanity committing suicide with this indiscriminate and tyrannical use of nature.
8. ***“Stop being negative.”*** Needing to talk badly about others indicates low self-esteem. That means, I feel so low that instead of picking myself up I have to cut others down. Letting go of negative things quickly is healthy.
9. ***“Don't proselytize; respect others' beliefs.”*** “We can inspire others through witness so that one grows together in communicating. But the worst thing of all is religious proselytism, which paralyzes.
10. ***“Work for peace.”*** “We are living in a time of many wars. And the call for peace must be shouted. Peace sometimes gives the impression of being quiet, but it is never quiet, peace is always proactive.
