


TWENTY-NINTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1st Reading: *Isaiah 53:10-11.* Through his suffering, the servant of Yahweh will justify many.

Responsorial Psalm: *Psalms 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22.* A prayer of praise for God's mercy.

2nd Reading: *Hebrews 4:14-16.* Jesus is the high priest who sympathizes with our weakness.

Gospel Reading: *Mark 10:35-45.* Jesus teaches that those who wish to be great must be the servant of all.



Reflecting on God's Word:

The text of this weekend's Isaiah reading speaks of a servant whose suffering and afflictions are borne for the many. Father Daniel Berrigan once said that the call of the disciple of Jesus is to absorb evil. Not very glorious, indeed, for servants absorb the leftovers of the household's extravagance. Those at the bottom of life's pyramid absorb the muck; swamps and lowlands absorb the runoff of life's fields. Just so parents absorb our tears. And those who forgive absorb the blow. As the warrior absorbs the enemy's hate, so the conscientious objector absorbs the need for revenge. So also the embrace absorbs our fears, justice absorbs mistrust, love absorbs the distance of hearts, and the sharing of bread absorbs the memory of pain. In such ways God makes the world new.

The fear, and perhaps the sadness as well, is that in absorbing the evil of life we do become at least to some extent that which we absorb. Then those who gaze upon us do so as if we ourselves were afflicted and diseased. Then those who minister to dying AIDS patients are themselves eyed with suspicion and fear. Then the conscientious objector is expelled by the patriot, and the selfless warrior is cast off into indifference by the righteous purist. Then the Alzheimer caregiver is forgotten; the one who forgives the abuse is revenged; and the one who combats poverty with generosity grows poorer while the hoarder is glorified. And, contradiction of contradictions, the crucified Christ becomes the Christ who reigns. And so we become like him.

Attention! October Count is Here! Please make a strong effort to attend Mass at ST. AGNES and HOLY TRINITY during the month of October. It is very important that we show good attendance!

SPIRITUAL IMPLICATIONS: If Sunday worship becomes peripheral in the life of an individual or household there is an obvious impact on faith. We need to be reminded that faith needs to be practiced in a tangible way. Faith is not merely a feeling but a discipline. It is a gift from the Lord but like other godly gifts, it requires spiritual attentiveness, development and use. The longer someone stays away from religious practice, especially Sunday worship, the harder it is to initiate it again. Many of our problems are related to a lack of faith and confusion about where God is when problems occur. I encourage every person and every household to keep Sunday worship a priority. And above all, attend the **Eucharistic celebrations**.

PASTORAL IMPLICATIONS: Decreasing Mass attendance (along with fewer priests) will require reorganization of parish life and a reduction of the number of weekend Masses. We may be creating fuller Churches because fewer worshippers require fewer liturgies and fewer worship spaces. **ATTEND MASS EVERY WEEKEND BECAUSE YOU COUNT AND WE COUNT ON YOU!**

Traditionally during the month of October, Catholics throughout the world are asked to support the missions in a special way on **World Mission Sunday**. This year the collection for World Mission Sunday is scheduled for this weekend, **October 17th and 18th**. Be supportive of the world-wide missions and concerns by your daily prayers of remembrance and, in particular, on Mission Sunday be true stewards for the Missions.


