FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: *Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27.* Paul and Barnabas proclaim the good news in many places.


Responsorial Psalm: *Psalm 145:8-9, 10-11, 12-13.* A song of praise to God.

Second Reading: *Revelation 21:1-5a.* John describes his vision of a new heaven and a new earth.

Gospel Reading: *John 13:31-33a, 34-35.* Jesus gives his disciples a new commandment: love one another.

Today's Gospel can be read as a continuing explanation of Jesus' act of washing his disciples' feet. It begins with the announcement that this is the moment when the Son of Man will be glorified. This theme continues throughout John's Passion. Jesus will be glorified in his death on the cross and in his Resurrection, and the disciples will glorify Jesus in the love they show.

John's Gospel does not present a sentimental view of love. This is a type of love that is shown in service and sacrifice. It is difficult to choose to love when faced with hatred and anger. Jesus tells the disciples that all will know that they are his disciples because of the love they show for one another. This description of the early Christian community will be repeated in the Acts of the Apostles: "See how they love one another." Christian love is the hallmark of Christianity. We see it lived in the witness of the martyrs. We see it in the example of the lives of the saints. We see it in the holy women and men who live and love daily, making small and large sacrifices for others.

NO BOTTOMS LEFT BEHIND DIAPER DRIVE

In support of Pope Francis' call to perform corporal works of mercy in this Jubilee Year of Mercy, St Agnes and Holy Trinity will be holding a diaper drive to benefit the Western PA Diaper Bank.

One in three American moms struggles to provide clean diapers for her children. Food stamps and WIC don't cover diapers. The families often are forced to make tough decisions because they can't afford diapers. Children can't go to daycare without a clean supply of diapers, preventing adults from going to work or school.

On Mother's Day weekend, May 7 and 8, we are asking parishioners to donate a bag of diapers (sizes 4, 5 and 6 are most needed) or the funds to buy them, (Checks can be made out to Western PA Diaper Bank). Place your donation in the boxes and envelopes provided at the back of Holy Trinity Church and St. Agnes Cafeteria.

Locally, diapers are distributed by the Western Pennsylvania Diaper Bank through the Duquesne Family Support Center, the McKeesport Salvation Army, and the Allegheny Intermediate Unit in Homestead to families in need registered with these agencies. MAY — A MONTH TO HONOR OUR BLESSED MOTHER

The month of May is beautiful for many reasons, but especially because it is set aside by the Church to honor Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and our Mother. While we honor and venerate Mary, we can at the same time ask for her help, since she has a powerful influence with God on our spiritual behalf.

The Church has composed a beautiful prayer to Mary, the *Hail Mary*. In the first half of this prayer we have two direct quotations from Scripture, words that were addressed to Mary by God's Angel, Gabriel, and also by her cousin, Elizabeth. The second half was composed by the Church. If we combine this prayer with the one that Jesus taught us, the *Our Father*, and add to these the *Glory Be* and the *Apostles Creed*, and think about the events in the life of Jesus and Mary while reciting them, we have the beautiful devotion that the Church encourages us to pray, the *Rosary*. *If you are not already in the habit of praying the Rosary daily, try to get into that habit during this month of May, and continue it throughout the year.*

At *Holy Trinity* a half-hour before the Masses on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday, all are invited in the recitation of the Rosary and seeking the intercession of Blessed Mary in all our needs. At *St. Agnes*, the recitation of the Rosary is before the weekend Masses of 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. Your participation as a community or individually in praying the Holy Rosary brings greater honor to our Blessed Lady.
