



In fact, 75% were non-parishioners, which is good and bad. Good, because it brings outside money into our Church, but bad, because many of our parishioners who benefitted didn't support our fundraiser. If they had, we could have sold the 55 tickets that were unsold. But, all in all, it was a great success. After expenses of food, drinks and tickets, since everything else was donated, we made \$15,250 for the Church of St. Max. That is up \$3,000 from last year.
